#### Dear Parents

ScopelT, who run our coding lessons that run each year, also run After School coding clubs, called CIY.Club (Code It Yourself Club).

We've arranged for ScopelT to host their CIY.Club again this year during lunchtimes for the last 8 weeks of term. CIY.Club is a Club encompassing a format where kids can come together to learn, train and improve their technology skills. CIY.Club exists as a curated program which includes self-driven, project based activities with both mentor support and mini-workshops. The overall goal of CIY is simple; to provide an environment which facilitates young coders to train to be creators of technology. It's compared to a Karate Class, where kids of all ages and skill levels come together to learn, train and improve. CIY.Club use a leveling system similar to the belt system in Karate, where the kids complete a certain number of achievements before they can 'Level Up' to reach their next level. Students are given coloured wristbands to denote their level instead of a belt.

CIY.Club is comprised of topics which develop skills in the areas of:

Coding • 3D Printing • Electronics & Robotics • Website & App Development

**How long would sessions run?** Each session runs for 1 hour and will be held Wed lunchtime in the library

What age groups? Code Wizards (7yrs - 12yrs)

What would be the cost per child? \$132 for the 8 weeks. This includes GST.

We would love to see 2019 students return so they can continue their progress and very keen to see any new students who would like to develop their digital technology skills. There are limited places available.
