BOOK WEEK



Book Week celebrates the amazing and talented Australian children's authors whose books are rich in language and of a high literary quality.

2020 is a very unique year and we have faced many challenges and changes. Book Week is no different. We will still be celebrating but have had to incorporate some changes in order to comply with health regulations. **Our Book Fair will be online**. I will still choose the books from the bookshop, The Learning Hub at Lindfield. There will be an option for you to choose and donate books to our library and an option for you to buy books for home. Please remember that it is through your donations that we are able to maintain a library of quality literature. Also, donating books is a wonderful opportunity to share with others that might not be able to buy books. Your child's name is placed in the front of the book on a nameplate to say they have donated the book. Donating means that many children have the opportunity to read the book thus supporting a reading community. The online link will be in Week one's newsletter next term and will be open from Friday 16th to Friday 30th October.

Our <u>Book parade will be on Friday 23rd October</u>. On this day children will come to school dressed as a character from a book. The children love making and creating their costumes. This is a wonderful opportunity for you as parents to spend encouraging 'talk' around books and reading as you help your child prepare their character costume.

Book Week Competitions - This year we will be having a writing competition at school. At school as part of their literacy in the first two weeks students will write a short story (maximum 500 words) about a curious creature. Then at home if they would like to, they can:

- 1. Create a collage of people in your family reading or people in your family with their favourite book This year we celebrate Book Week, <u>Curious creatures</u>, <u>Wild Minds 17th -23rd October</u>. Book Week is an important part of our school year. The excitement of dressing up as a book character is important but what is even more valuable is the talk that surrounds it about books. These discussions about books and characters are vital in creating a reading community. At Prouille, we aim to create lifelong readers and what better way to support this than through being part of a reading community.
- 2. Make a bookmark that has this year's theme Curious creatures, wild minds These will be due Thursday 22nd October.
