LITERACY NEWS

This week Years 1-6 completed assessments called PAT tests (Progressive Achievement Tests) in Reading and Mathematics. These assessments allow teachers to accurately and efficiently measure students' abilities diagnose gaps, strengths and weaknesses in student learning, monitor student progress over time.

The assessments have been developed especially, but not exclusively, for use in Australian schools. The PAT assessments are designed to be engaging and to encourage students to interact with the content to the best of their ability. They allow teachers to collect evidence of learning, student to identify where students are in their learning at a given point in time, to monitor growth over time, and to reflect on student attainment. The use of assessment data is to help us to identify starting points for learning, target teaching and monitor growth.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING (PBL) AT PROUILLE

What is PBL?

At Prouille we have adopted a proactive and responsive approach to supporting student behaviour and learning. Our PBL (POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING) whole school approach is adapted from the PBIS (Positive Behaviour Intervention Support) system and has an emphasis on teaching children what behaviours are expected and then supporting them to be successful with these behaviours.

There are three school rules which the children know and understand: At Prouille we are **Respectful**, **Responsible Learners**.

These three rules are each supported by more specific behavioural expectations that are aligned with our Dominican values, that include we are fair and just, we make good choices, we show a positive attitude, etc.

The behavioural expectations are taught in a variety of contexts across the school and children are given opportunities to use and practice these behaviours and students are rewarded when these positive behaviours are demonstrated.

When PBL is implemented well, teachers and students have more time to focus on relationships and classroom instruction. For the remainder of the year all classes (K-6) will focus on the following behaviours.

At Prouille, we are responsible when we make good choices (Prayer & Contemplation)

At Prouille, we are learners when we are cooperative- Walk safely and respectfully around the school. (Community)

Students will be provided with explicit lessons based on these rules, with opportunities to model and practise these behaviours in a supportive environment.

HOME LINK

How can parents support these behaviour expectations at home?

We are responsible when we make good choices.

How can I make good choices at home? Discuss:

What could I do if my brother/ sister were mean to me?

What could I do if my brother/ sister were watching a TV show that I didn't want to watch?

What could I do if I found money in my house?

We are learners when we are cooperative.

Do we have rules at home for moving safely and respectfully around the house/yard?

Discuss as a family rules we have at home or in the car or when we are out with mum and dad that are about us being safe.

Design a poster to keep on the fridge to remind us of our safety rules.


