Dear Parents and Carers,

This Sunday marks the start of my favourite time of not only the Liturgical Year but the year as a whole! Advent not only signals to us that it is only 4 Sundays till Christmas Eve but the first Sunday of Advent is the start of the new Church and Liturgical year. The word 'Advent' comes from the Latin word adventus, which means 'coming' or 'visit'. During this time we connect with the longing and expectant waiting of the Jewish people as they prepared for the advent of the Messiah. We also look forward with similar longing and expectancy to the second advent of Christ that we have been promised.

As you all know, one of the special colours associated with the season of Advent is purple. To mark the significance of this important season for us, we are asking all students and staff to wear purple to school this Monday (29th November). It can be as small as a purple ribbon in the hair or as 'full-on" as all purple clothing! The Year 6 Mission Leaders will celebrate a short liturgy in our Zoomberly on Monday and lead the school in prayer each day throughout Advent.

PROUILLE CHRISTMAS NATIVITY ZOOM AND 2021 PRINCIPAL'S AWARDS

END OF YEAR MASS/LITURGY

We have been working closely with the parish and Fr. Paul to ensure we celebrate the end of the school year with our important Catholic traditions in mind. Upon discussions with the diocese and the Vicar General, we received the following response to a whole school mass in the church:-

"According to the tier of restrictions on which schools are currently operating on: Whole of school Masses are possible outdoors on the school site without outside attendees, Individual class Masses can be in the parish church but without any other attendees

So, at this stage it is not possible for the whole of Prouille to come to Holy Name for an end of vear Mass."

To this end, we are working on a whole school Mass at school with just the children either outdoors or zoomed to classrooms and families. (As per Level 3 COVID restrictions).

This will be held on the last day of school on Wednesday the 15th December at 12.00 pm concluding with a celebratory ice block for all students, parents are invited to take children home after the liturgy/mass.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING (PBL) AT PROUILLE

As the end of the year approaches, and there is a 'buzz in the air' with anticipation for the upcoming Christmas holidays, teachers are continuing to ensure consistency across K-6, in regard to Positive Behaviours for Learning (PBL).

Each class is actively engaging in a daily PBL lesson, where students are provided with opportunities to learn about and action specific PBL rules. Teachers reinforce expectations within a positive framework, and work with the students using the following strategies:

PRACTISE

(Lead the children through the behaviour and allow them time to practise, role play, etc)

ACKNOWLEDGE

(Reinforcement for expected behaviour, corrective feedback for misbehaviour)

(REMEMBER the 4 Rs of PBL – Remind, Reteach, Redirect and Remove)

STUDENT REFLECTION QUESTIONS

- Do I take every opportunity to learn?
- Have I made good choices today?
- Could I have done something differently today?
- Why is it important to make good choices?
- What choices could I make tomorrow?
- Have I remembered to move safely around the school today?
- Have I cared for my own safety by having shoelaces done up?
- Have I helped another person to be safe?
- Have I cared for school property and the school environment by moving safely?
- Have I followed safety rules on my way to and from school?

Our wonderful Year 6 SRC leaders have created videos to help support students with understanding the expectations and behaviours associated with each PBL rule, which have been shown during school zoomberlys.

Thank you for your support, as we strive to enable all students to become **RESPECTFUL**, **RESPONSIBLE**, **LEARNERS** at Prouille.

RE CORNER

Advent is a time of waiting, remembering, hoping, and thanking God for becoming one of us. It is the liturgical season of four weeks devoted to preparation for the coming of Christ at Christmas. We encourage all Prouille families to celebrate the liturgical year at home. Practicing our faith is essential in forming our Catholic identity. Advent is one way to make memories and traditions that will last a lifetime for the faith of your family. Below are three ways you may like to prepare for the season of Advent with your children:

- Set up a place to pray together in your home, for example the kitchen or dining room table or a table in a corner of the room.
- Use a symbol of Advent such as an advent wreath. Place it on coloured prayer cloth that reflects the season -Advent uses purple
- 3. Choose a time that the family can gather regularly and pray in the evening or morning or before a meal.

Loving God, together with those around the world who struggle on their journeys. we gather around this wreath and pray with joyful hope that the light of Christ will illuminate our paths. We praise you for the gift of your son. Jesus Christ. light of the world and hope of all nations. STUDENT WORK

Recently I have been sharing student work with you from different grades. This time I would like to share a letter that a Year 2 student shared with me. I have checked with Liam and he agreed that I shouldn't be the only person to read this!!

To my teachers,

I would like to tell you some things about autism. Autism makes me cry easily. For example, when I do something wrong, or do my work wrong.

I like to call it autism or AS, not ASD- because it's not really a disorder. It's a spectrum, and a different way of thinking. I'm really smart and notice things that other people might not.

Some people think that autistic people don't feel or show emotions. They actually do, and most feel emotions more intensely. Sometimes, it feels like I'm at a beach and there's a wave of worries coming over me. Deep breaths can help a bit.

When I'm overwhelmed, it's not easy for other people to tell. My face might go a bit red and I might look like I'm about to cry. Having a quick play with squishy toys or a break in the reading corner can help me calm down.

I find it hard when things change. Last minutes are the worst. When things change, giving me reminders can be really helpful. If it's a sudden change, a quick explanation would be good.

When things are brand new I can get really worried and think "I can't do it". I might need a few more check-ins than the other kids.

Most kids are kind and understand my autism. There has been one kid who didn't, but that's been better recently. I hope that everyone keeps being so understanding. When I'm doing something exciting you might see me rocking back and forth with my body. That's called stimming. Stimming helps me get my excitement out and I'd feel sad if someone told me to stop it. In fact, I can't stop it. It's just my body's reaction to excitement.

Autism doesn't mean I should be treated like I'm not a real person. I should be treated like anyone else.


