END OF TERM ASSEMBLY MONDAY 4th APRIL 2022

CSBB YEAR 6 LEADERSHIP DAY

On Thursday 31st March our Year Six students attended a virtual Leadership Day with the theme 'The Light of my Leadership'. To begin the day, students listened to our Director of Schools Mr Danny Casey as he spoke of the importance of servant leadership and how we too could lead in the way of Jesus Christ. Students were then able to virtually join all Year 6 schools across the Diocese in liturgy. After the liturgy, Year

Six were privileged to be able to listen to an interview with Bishop Anthony who spoke about who he admired and the many influences he had as a child growing up. Following the liturgy students participated in a number of activities including researching an influential Australian Leader and answering the key questions:

- What impact do they have on others?
- What is the light of their leadership in Australia today?
- What might I gain/learn from this?

To end the day our students created an artistic representation of a scripture passage on light, with many students choosing to complete a biblical micrography, illuminated text or piccollage. Bienne & Ruby said that "today we learnt how to be a leader and saw what was required by others to be a leader. We researched the good qualities of a good leader and who we looked up to as positive role models and who helps people".



COVID UPDATE

We have had a number of COVID cases in our school this week. To minimise any risk of spread, staff continue to remind students to sanitise or wash their hands and keep the windows open in classrooms to ensure good ventilation. Some staff and students are choosing to wear masks even though it is not mandatory and our hygienist at school wipes surfaces down each day. Please remember to not send children to school who are displaying COVID symptoms without first doing a RAT.



Although we have had a number of cases throughout the term, our numbers have neither been the highest or lowest in the diocese. It is important we continue to be diligent and hopefully avoid days when we may not be able to replace staff who are unwell.

PROBLEMS WITH PHONES

Recently we were asked to move all our phone services to the NBN in line with the other residents of Water St. Following the migration to the NBN we have experienced a range of problems with the phones. This includes calls not coming through, poor phone lines, a different voice mail message with no line connected as well as no call waiting when our administration staff are already on the phone.

We have escalated this disruption to CSBB and the Telco and ask that you please continue to be understanding and patient and let us know if you are experiencing problems while we sort through the ongoing issues.

NAPLAN UPDATE



Students in Year 3 and Year 5 are participating in NAPLAN this year. NAPLAN gives schools and school systems valuable information to inform planning for teaching and learning.

Over the last two weeks, the students have participated in practice tests that provide them with examples of the Numeracy, Spelling, Language Conventions and Reading questions. Year 5 also completed a practice writing test online. These tests familiarise the students with the online platform and the types of questions they will be asked. These tests are also an opportunity to work out any technical difficulties that may occur with the test or devices

The practice tests are not marked and schools/students do not receive feedback.

The testing window for the 'real' NAPLAN tests is from the 11 - 20 May. We will let you know days and dates for the testing early next term. We will always plan for 'catch-up' tests in the 2 weeks should children be away. There were a number of children who did not have working headphones for the practice test and although we are prepared with spares, could we please ask that your child has working headphones or earbuds for the May testing period.

CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

On Sunday 27th March at 3:30pm at Holy Name Parish Wahroonga our Year 3 students celebrated their sacrament of confirmation. During confirmation the children received the Holy Spirit, confirming them to Christ and strengthening them so that they may bear witness to Christ in faith and love.

This term we trialled a start-up company called *Luncher* to provide quality lunches for our students through an online ordering system. Thank you to the parents that have tried the service and provided feedback.

As staff we have also provided feedback as to the size, variety, quality and types of food and flavours. Much of our feedback has been about what children eat and how they access the food. *Luncher* has taken this on board and is putting in place a new menu for Term 2 that incorporates smaller portion sizes, easier to eat finger food, less spice and more kid-friendly food.

Any sibling of current students that are looking to enrol for Kindy 2023, we will be starting our enrolment interview process next term and welcome any applications.




EVACUATION DRILL NEXT WEEK

Next week, the whole school will take part in an Evacuation Drill. MATHS OLYMPIAD

Last week a team of students selected from Years 5 and 6 participated in the first of five tests as part of the 2022 Maths Olympiad. The tests contain highly complex and varied problems involving multiple strategies and mathematical thinking skills. competition continues across the year with students working together in practice sessions in preparation for each test. The main aims are to introduce important concepts, build strategies for problem solving, encourage creativity and intuition, stimulate enthusiasm for mathematics and satisfaction in meeting challenges.



MATHEMATICS PROBLEMS SOLVING IN TERM 2

Apart from the Maths Olympiad team, students from Years 3 to 6 will be engaging in various mathematical problem-solving opportunities in Term 2. All students in Years 3 and 4 will be introduced to the Maths Explorer program. The program allows students to collaborate with peers and work together to make decisions about the way they explore problems. Years 5 and 6 students will be taking part in the Maths Games program. Maths Games provides opportunities for all students to learn problem solving skills and exposes them to the application of mathematical problem-solving strategies and techniques.

WRITER'S CLUB

This term Writer's Club has focussed on writing a mystery. With the guidance of Susan and Alicia from the State Library of

NSW the students have been adding to and developing a mystery story each week. Our students' ideas and parts of their stories are often shared on the zoom. The students have enjoyed writing the mystery and we look forward to sharing their finished stories with the school community next term.

STAFF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT SPELLING

Throughout this term for Professional Learning, the staff have focussed on effectively teaching spelling strategies across the school. This has built on the professional learning we did last year with spelling. We have looked specifically at developing a consistent editing code across the school starting with Kindergarten and building on it each year. Editing is an important part of the writing process. Then linking the spelling strategies back to editing to empower the students to recognise which strategy they are using. It has been a valuable and positive process with teachers sharing the spelling from their classrooms, analysing, planning, acting and reviewing how they teach the strategies in the classroom.
