Attendance

Next term we'll be adhering strictly to our start and finish times. A parent must always accompany a child to the office to sign them in via Compass if late. Children are not allowed to do this on their own at any time of the day.

Please note as per this excerpt from our school's handbook that school starts at 8.50am, the school hours are as follows: -

SCHOOL HOURS

Before school duty - 8.20am

8.50: Music will play for 5 minutes signaling time to start moving to lines

8.55: Bell will sound signaling that all grades move to classes

9.00: Bell will sound signaling the start of all lessons for the morning sessions

Crunch n' Sip takes is determined by each individual class when they want to have their fruit/veggie break.

Recess

11.00: Bell will sound signaling time to move down to lower playground.

2 teachers, 30-minute duty

11.30: Bell will sound to signal the end of recess

Lunch

1.30: Bell will sound to signal start of lunch. 10 minutes supervised eating time. 4 teachers, 2 x 20-minute duties: 1.30pm – 1.50pm and 1.50pm – 2.10pm

1.40: Bell will sound to signal the end of eating and go play please encourage children to clean up rubbish, don't allow students to move off until all clean (PBL points for clean areas)

2.08: Bell will sound to signal end of lunch and time to start moving to lines

2.10 Bell will sound to signal end of lunch

End of school day

3.00: Music will play to signal end of day and start to pack up and move to front of

school for dismissal at 3.05

3.05: Bell will sound to signal end of day and dismissal

3.10: Drive-Thru pick-up will commence - please encourage parents to move on from the front to keep the area clear for drive-thru pick up (Slow n' Go)


