Dear Parents and Carers,

Week 7 of each term at Prouille is known as Wellbeing Week. 

# Parent Engagement Coordinator (PEC) Prouille Catholic School Wahroonga

With students at the centre of everything we do, our purpose is to inspire hearts and minds to know Christ and grow in faith. We encourage students to use their talents to be the best they can be. In order to help support this vision, we are looking for an inspiring and faith-led **Parent Engagement Coordinator**.

The Parent Engagement Coordinator role has been developed in direct response to community feedback and aligned with the towards 2025 strategy to strengthen family, school and diocesan relationships. This process was undertaken in consultation with key stakeholders; CSBB leaders, principals, parents, clergy, Catholic care and the chancery. This part time position will play a crucial role in building and maintaining a welcoming, respectful community, while strengthening relationships between school, parents/families and the wider catholic community. The PEC must be adaptable, creative and able to customise their work to meet the diverse needs of the community and respond to parent feedback.

PEC will primarily work in partnership with a range of stakeholders: the principal, parents/carers/families, school counsellor, Catholic Care, Parish priest and the Religious Education Coordinator/Youth Minister. The PEC will work in two focus areas; supporting Family Wellbeing to promote learning & engaging all families in the Catholic school community.

If you are someone passionate about strengthening family, school, parish, and Diocesan relationships this might be the right opportunity for you, providing a potential pathway to other leadership positions.

This is a temporary part-time 0.3 FTE role (which may be carried out within or in addition to your existing role) for the 2022 school year commencing in term 3, 2022. The PEC will report to the Principal (with guidance from the Parish Priest). The PEC will be expected to work 0.3 FTE across the school and parish during the week and will be renumerated as 0.4 FTE.

### Essential Responsibilities

### The PEC will operate in the following two focus areas:

- Supporting Family Wellbeing to promote learning
- Engaging all families in the Catholic school community to achieve better learning outcomes in response to parent feedback.

- a) Develop genuine/mutually respectful relationships with families/parents in the parish/school community
- b) Facilitate, coordinate and communicate, and where necessary organise and implement activities and programs to meet the spiritual and well-being needs of the families/parents in the school/parish community.
- Build links and connections between primary and secondary through Youth ministry and Diocesan initiatives to better support transition and the K-12 pathways offered by CSBB
- Establishing and strengthening links with school counsellors and Catholic Care as key referral professionals

### Suitable qualifications in:

- Education, Welfare, Health, Pastoral Ministry or related disciplines
- Experience working in education and/or pastoral ministry would be desirable (e.g. sacramental program, parent education programs)

### Applicants must have the following:

- Valid working with children check
- Current NSW driver's licence
- · Comprehensively insured motor vehicle

# **NAPLAN CHANGES**

**FAQs** - In response to proficiency standards being introduced on the Individual Student Report (ISR) in 2023

### **PUBLIC / PARENTS**

Possible questions	Answers	
What is changing?	<ul> <li>From 2023, NAPLAN results will be represented differently in the Individual Student Report (ISR) given to parents and carers.</li> <li>The numerical bands (1-10) will be replaced with four proficiency standards for each school level that sits NAPLAN.</li> </ul>	
Why is it changing?	<ul> <li>The changes have been led by ACARA and are in response to parent feedback over the years, that the reports need to be clearer and results easier to interpret.</li> <li>The NAPLAN numerical scale was developed for the paper-based assessments in 2008. All schools have now transitioned to NAPLAN tests online.</li> <li>Online tests provide richer, more precise data on each student's core skills. This provides a better picture of how each child is progressing against the levels of achievement expected for their school year.</li> </ul>	
When will it change?	From this year. The changes will be reflected in this year's     Individual Student Report (ISR) that schools provide to parents     and carers.	
Why this year?	It is important for the NAPLAN reforms to be implemented in the same year:  introduce proficiency standards, move the test to Term 1 and reset the scale.  Each year a lot of statistical work is required to maintain a year-on-year equivalence with the current scale, as well as between the paper and online tests. Resetting the scale now will ensure results are returned to schools and parents earlier in the year.	
Why proficiency standards?	<ul> <li>Proficiency standards describe what students at each year level are expected to know and should be able to do in literacy and numeracy at the time of NAPLAN testing.</li> <li>Reporting NAPLAN results against proficiency standards corresponds with the style of reporting in other international assessments Australia participates in.</li> </ul>	
	The NAPLAN report will have 4 easy-to-understand proficiency standards:	

What will the new proficiency standards be called?	<ul> <li>Exceeding</li> <li>Strong</li> <li>Developing</li> <li>Needs additional support.</li> </ul>
	Strong means that the student is meeting the expectations of the literacy and numeracy skills required for their school level.
Will my child need to score higher marks to meet the new proficiency standards?	<ul> <li>The proficiency standards are new standards that are not linked to the previous national minimum standard.</li> <li>The four proficiency standards have been set against reasonable expectations of literacy and numeracy skills required for the school year level.</li> <li>The new proficiency standards will provide you with a clearer picture of where your child's skills lie against these expectations so you can easily identify their strengths as well as any areas that may need further support.</li> </ul>
Were parents or schools consulted about this decision?	<ul> <li>The new standards and ISRs were developed with input from all education authorities and sectors as well as with parents through parent focus groups.</li> <li>The decision was also based on regular feedback received by ACARA from parents for the need to simplify the report, so it is easier to interpret.</li> </ul>
NAPLAN is earlier this year which leaves less time for learning before the test. How will this affect my child's results?	<ul> <li>Questions in NAPLAN tests are primarily based on what students have learned from previous years of schooling. This has not changed.</li> <li>Testing in Term 1 means results can be returned to schools earlier in the year, so parents and teachers have more time to identify areas of strength and act if a child's needs support.</li> <li>Results set against the proficiency standards are easier to interpret. This will provide you with a clear view of your child's literacy and numeracy skills compared to what is expected in their year level.</li> </ul>
How will this change affect my child's performance?	<ul> <li>This change will not affect your child's performance because what is being measured has not changed.</li> <li>NAPLAN results should always be considered together with school assessments and reports. Proficiency standards are not the only factor that determines a student's overall academic success.</li> </ul>
What will the new ISR report look like?	The numerical bands will be removed and replaced with four proficiency standards across all years.

	The ISR will continue to show the national average and the range of achievement of the middle 60% of students in a particular year level.
Are proficiency standards easy to understand?	<ul> <li>Proficiency standards are more descriptive, easier to interpret and meaningful. This will help parents have a better understanding of their child's literacy and numeracy abilities.</li> <li>Further information and resources will be provided in Term 2 once testing has been completed.</li> </ul>
My child is in Year 5. I need to provide the report to the high school. Is it possible to get the report in bands?	<ul> <li>It will not be possible as the numerical bands have been removed and will no longer be available.</li> <li>All students across the country will receive the same new Individual Student Report (ISR).</li> </ul>
How will I know if my child is achieving where they need to?	<ul> <li>Proficiency standards in the ISR will provide a clear view of your child's performance in literacy and numeracy. This will help you interpret the results better.</li> <li>If you have concerns about your child's performance, it is best to discuss these with the teacher.</li> </ul>
My school has not mentioned this – does this mean it does not affect my child?	<ul> <li>These changes were announced on 10 February. ACARA and the NSW NAPLAN team will be communicating this to all schools.</li> <li>NAPLAN is a national assessment so all students across the country will be receiving the new ISR.</li> <li>Further information will be provided in Term 2 once testing has been completed.</li> </ul>
Can I still see if my child's achievement compares with the national average?	Yes. The report will continue to show your child's performance against the national and school average and the range of achievement for the middle 60% of students at that year level. This has not changed.
What do I do if I do not understand the new report?	<ul> <li>Speak to your child's teacher in the first instance.</li> <li>Teachers will be able to provide you with a complete view of your child's academic progress and can help explain how it aligns with the proficiency standards.</li> </ul>
What information will the new reports give me that I have not received before?	The written explanations will help you interpret the results more clearly so you can identify whether your child is achieving the expected milestones for their year level.
What does this mean for my child's learning progress?	<ul> <li>Proficiency standards reflect new educational expectations.</li> <li>Proficiency standards inform and guide better student achievement over time.</li> </ul>


