



"I was ordained a priest in 1990 at St Michael's Church, Meadowbank"

"I have worked in many parishes all over Sydney such as Bankstown, Strathfield, Kogarah, St Mary's Cathedral, Balmain, Miranda, Bonnyrigg, Maroubra Bay and Rose Bay."

#### What made you want to become a priest?

"It was a strong calling from God when I was 25 in 1983. I wanted to help feel better about themselves"

#### Can you tell us a little about your family?

"I grew up in Glebe in the 1960's and 1970's. I have 3 older brothers and a younger sister, my mother and father. We lived in a terrace house together"

#### Where did you go to school?

"I attended primary school at St James in Forest Lodge and then High School at Holy Cross at Ryde"

#### What do you like most about being a priest?

"I love celebrating sacraments and mass, talking, listening and helping people so that I can bring them closer to Jesus."

### What do you find challenging as a priest?

"Trying to talk to people about Jesus today as a lot of people sometimes don't want to hear about Jesus. It can sometimes be a little harder to get the message out there to people"



### What do you like to do in your spare time?

"I love going to the beach, swimming, playing music-piano, going out with my priest friends on a Monday. I also like going to the movies and bush walking.

#### What is your favourite food?

"I love to eat Spaghetti Bolognese"

#### Do you have a special talent?

"I play the piano. I started learning when I was 12 and I played the organ in church. I love music"

Our next Open Day will be held on Wednesday 2nd August at 10-11am and 6-6:30pm. Please scan the QR code below to register.
















