





















## **SCHOOL UPDATES**



I am very pleased to announce that our school will be providing our own support classes for students with a disability from 2024. Our school currently hosts two St Lucy's satellite classes, and the current lease agreement with St Lucy's for our site will officially cease at the end of Term 4 2023. At this time Catholic Schools Broken Bay will commence Eileen O'Connor Support Classes at Prouille.

Bishop Anthony Randazzo and Director of Schools Danny Casey are committed to our families, current and prospective, and are focused on extending educational opportunities and choices within Broken Bay. To foster ongoing positive partnerships and outcomes for our students with disabilities we will be growing the support class options across our Diocese.

This year Catholic Schools Broken Bay commenced kindergarten support classes, which have been very successful at both St Martin's Catholic Primary School, Davidson, and St Brendan's Catholic Primary School, Lake Munmorah. The additional support classes at Prouille commencing in 2024 aligns with our vision to provide authentic Catholic professional education and demonstrates our commitment to providing the best possible education for all our students.

It is important to note that current provisions and classes within our school will remain unchanged. This is an exciting opportunity to provide a streamlined inclusive school environment for our community.
