





#### Year 3 Platypus Ice Melting Challenge: Materials in Action

Year 3 Platypus students embarked on a fun and educational experiment to determine which material melts ice the fastest. Armed with a range of substances—heat, dirt, insulation, salt, and sugar—the young scientists set up a series of tests to observe and compare the effects on ice cubes. They carefully applied each material to separate ice cubes, tracking how quickly and efficiently each one melted the ice. As they conducted their experiment, students recorded their observations, measured melting rates, and analyzed the results.






#### YEAR 5 GOANNA



#### **END OF TERM LUNCH**


Dear Parents & Carers,
