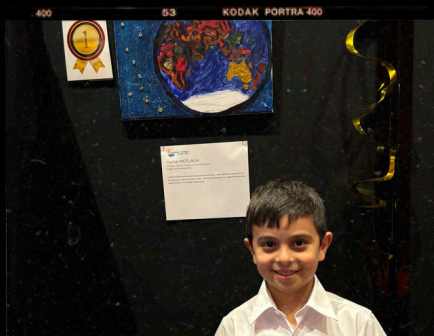



RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS

Christ the King

The Solemnity of Christ the King reminds us that even as we are preparing for Advent and Christmas Time, we must prepare ourselves for the second coming of Christ at the end of time, when he will bring about the Kingdom of God on Earth.

Gospel-John 18:33-37

Pilate then went back inside. He called Jesus over and asked, "Are you the king of the Jews?" Jesus answered, "Are you asking this on your own or did someone tell you about me?" "You know I'm not a Jew!" Pilate said. "Your own people and the chief priests brought you to me. What have you done?" Jesus answered, "My kingdom doesn't belong to this world. If it did, my followers would have fought to keep me from being handed over to our leaders. No, my kingdom doesn't belong to this world." "So, you are a king," Pilate replied. You are saying that I am a king," Jesus told him. "I was born into this world to tell about the truth. And everyone who belongs to the truth knows my voice."

In the Gospel, Pilate and Jesus discuss kingship-both have very different ideas of what a king is. Jesus is not interested in taking over any earthly kingdoms. He is interested only in being the king of our hearts. Jesus' Kingdom is not of this world. The reason he came to earth was to create God's Kingdom. He lived his entire life showing us how to establish it on earth. We are called to live our lives as disciples of Christ. This is how all will know that we are part of God's Kingdom.



REMEMBRANCE DAY

Last Monday, Prouille School marked Remembrance Day with a solemn and meaningful ceremony. This significant day commemorates the end of the fighting on the Western Front in World War I, which concluded at 11am on November 11, 1918, after four years of devastating conflict. Year 4 students led a beautiful and respectful ceremony, guiding the school through this important occasion. We were privileged to have Joshua Bradley perform *The Last Post* and *The Rouse* on the bugle, accompanied by Mr. Jason McCallum's moving rendition on the bagpipes. At the going down of the sun and in the morning, we will remember them - "The Ode", Laurence Binyon

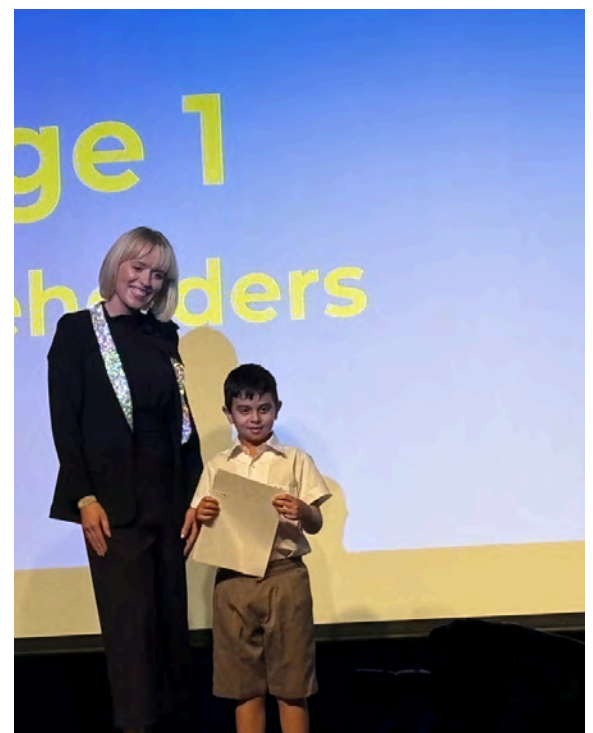


RELIGIOUS CREATIVE ARTS SHOWCASE

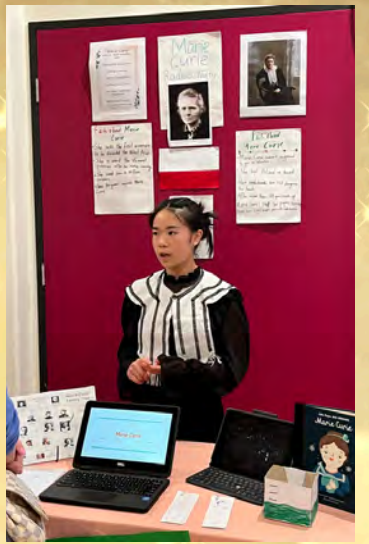
Night OF THE NOTABLES

The pedagogical aims of the project centre on the research strategies taught and higher-order thinking skills in selecting, analysing and synthesising research materials.

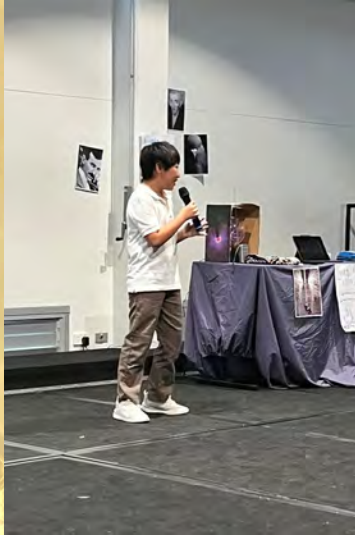
During the program, the key concepts of Power, (looking at Values and Human Behaviour, Freedom, Rights and Responsibilities) and Christian Values were explored.









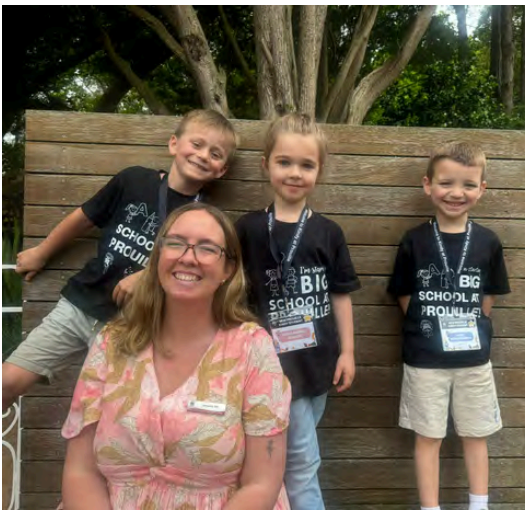

As we near the end of the year, now is the time to look through your bookshelves at home for any overdue library books!



U-turns and 3-point turns in school zones

Always park and turn legally around schools and avoid dangerous manoeuvres like U-turns and 3-point turns.



► U-turns

Not allowed:

- at an intersection without traffic lights, where a 'no U-turn' sign is displayed
- at traffic lights, unless there is a U-turn permitted sign or,
- across
 - a single continuous dividing line
 - a single continuous dividing line to the left of a broken line or,
 - two parallel continuous dividing lines.

Penalty exceeds \$410 + 3 demerit points (in a school zone)

► 3-point turns and reversing

You should avoid 3-point turns and reversing:

- at school zones
- in and out of driveways

*NOTE: Fines are subject to change without notice. These penalties apply in school zones and are current as of **September 2024**.

Road safety



Children's and supervised crossings

For your child's safety, it's very important they always use a pedestrian crossing if there is one available. It is the safest point at which to cross the road.

At all crossings you must wait on the footpath, at least one step back from the edge of the road.

Supervised crossings

If there is a School Crossing Supervisor, wait until they have stopped the traffic and called you to cross.

If you are driving, you must not proceed until the School Crossing Supervisor's hand-held sign is no longer displayed, or until the crossing supervisor indicates that you may proceed through the crossing.

Children's crossings

Children's crossings are usually part-time crossings that operate before and after school

hours. They can also operate at other times when children use the crossing for excursions or during break times. When 'Children Crossing' flags are displayed, you must stop at the white line if pedestrians are waiting to cross. Drivers must remain stationary until the crossing is clear of pedestrians.



Children learn safe road user habits from you and will continue them when they are old enough to travel alone.

Road safety

Hold your child's hand

Your child may be easily distracted and too small to be seen by drivers. They are still developing skills that help them to predict or identify dangers and may tend to act impulsively.

An adult should always be responsible for your child's safety when out and about.

Talk with your child about safe behaviour on the footpath. It's not a safe place to play as it is near the road and vehicles may be entering or exiting driveways.

Until your child is at least 8 years old, hold their hand:

- on the footpath
- in the car park
- when crossing the road.

Then, up until at least 10 years old, supervise your child very closely, and hold their hand when crossing the road.

If you can't be with your child, organise for another trusted adult to accompany them.

At the end of the school day, your child may be excited, distracted or tired and often not concentrating on what is happening around them. Help keep them safe by meeting your child at the school gate. Never call them across the road.

Children learn safe road user habits from you and will continue them when they are old enough to travel alone.



Key road safety messages to share with your child in Kindergarten to Year 2

- Hold a grown up's hand when:
 - you cross the road
 - you're on the footpath
 - you're in a car park

Key road safety messages to share with your child in Years 3 to 6

- Hold an adult's hand when you cross the road (until at least 10)
- Use a safe place to cross the road
- Stop! Look! Listen! Think! every time you cross the road and keep checking until safely across

MOTORISED WHEELED DEVICES



Devices such as electric scooters, skateboards, and hoverboards are **ILLEGAL** in NSW.

Although a motorised scooter, skateboard, or hoverboard (electric or petrol powered) are considered motor vehicles, they do not satisfy the Australian Design Rules and for this reason, cannot be registered in NSW and are unable to be insured.

These devices cannot be ridden on roads, or road related areas (such as footpaths shared paths and cycleways) in NSW, except on private land.



Anyone caught riding a motorised device on a road or road related area in NSW can face fines starting from \$723

24 November *Our Lord JESUS CHRIST, KING of the UNIVERSE*

Dear friends,

This Sunday is the Feast of Christ the King. Jesus' Kingship is a Universal one which rules in the hearts of women and men. The late St John Paul II had this to say about the Kingship of Christ: 'How marvellous is this King who renounces all the signs of power, the instruments of dominion, force and arrogance, and wishes to reign only with the power of truth and love, with the power of interior conviction and sheer abandonment.'

In the Gospel of St John (18:33-37) Jesus has a dialogue with Pilate about the nature of His Kingship. Jesus in response to Pilate's question answers: 'Yes, I am a king. I was born for this, I came into the world for this: to bear witness to the truth; and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice.' The Gospel says that from that moment on Pilate wanted to set Jesus free, but pressure from the chief priests and the crowd prevented Pilate from acting to save Jesus. Jesus then goes onto fully initiate His Kingdom by dying on the cross.

The great paradox of Christianity is that the throne of the Kingdom is symbolized by the cross and Jesus' dying for all so that all may have life in him. This King, as St John Paul II says, 'shuns power and instruments of dominion... and wishes only to reign with truth and love.'

So let us not be seduced by pride, power and greed that many earthly leaders in our secular world crave. Let us keep our eyes on Christ, who loved people more than things and showed us how to live with truth and dignity.
